

Tips For Helping Your Children Memorize God's Word



6 In the car on the way home from church, the student can hold his scripture card, hiding the words. The family can take turns guessing some of the words in the scripture: "God?" Yes! One point. "Love?" Yes! One point! See which family member has the most

points by the time you get home. If your car ride is longer, family members can use the words they've guessed and try to unscramble them and say the entire scripture in the right order. By this time, the student holding the card and answering the family's guesses, will practically have the scripture memorized!

5 Buy a scrap book especially for the collected scripture cards. After church on Sunday, or midweek, have your child create an illustration to go along with the card. Sign it, date it, and keep this scripture illustration scrapbook for some special memories.

7 Use a long, empty wall in your home (hallway, up the stairs) to tape up the cards in a long line, add black "wheels" on each card and make it a "Scripture Train." Add an engine on the front, with the conductor shouting out the window, "TRAIN yourself to memorize God's Word!!" Parents can put a special sticker on each "train car" that the children have memorized.
